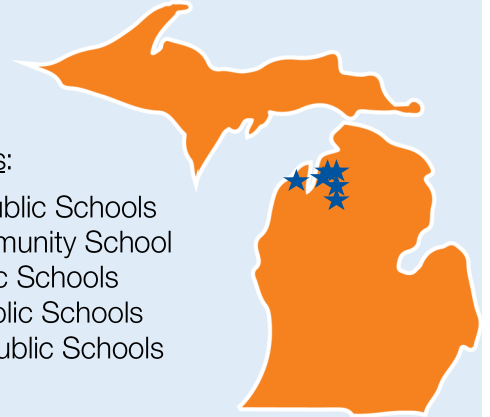
Whether it's clean clothes, help with school work, or someone to talk to when things get tough, we connect students with the relationships and resources they need to succeed.
