She provides sensory breaks for kids who need help regulating their emotions and behaviors, offering a calming presence in moments of distress. Additionally, she lends her expertise in behavioral interventions, working one on one with students to address specific challenges. In the social-emotional learning domain, Cherwinski leads small group sessions, empowering

students with essential life skills. She goes to great lengths to ensure each student has access to guidance and support to thrive academically and personally.

During the event, Cherwinski was joined by enthusiastic students, Lenyx, Cole, Eliana, and Jewel, who held the ribbon as she cut it, symbolizing the partnership between CIS and Vanderbilt Area School. Students proudly wore their custom Vanderbilt School shirts, provided by CIS through a grant from the Michigan Department of Education, showcasing school spirit and the organization's commitment to the community. Students cheered "All in for Kids" as the ribbon was cut to celebrate the partnership, and then were surprised with cookies donated by Family Fare in Gaylord, adding to the celebratory atmosphere. Dr. Harwood delivered a heartfelt speech, emphasizing the importance of the CIS-Vanderbilt Area School collaboration in supporting student success.
